VI. President Mininsky called for Questions and Comments from The Public – Items on Today's Agenda Only

Questions and Comments from the Public – Items on Tonight's Agenda Only

- Joanne Rea 90 Connecticut Avenue had some questions regarding the award of bid. Would the positions remain the same; would the district continue under current guidelines (yes); what is the district's position on the continuation of \$3.25 for the price of lunch (same); what is the financial gain of the outsourcing (\$150,000-\$180,000 per year); if the bid is accepted would members of the food service by asked first for jobs (yes); how would 10 month employees be notified. (President Mininsky discussed that the bid had only been received yesterday and would likely be tabled until more information was gathered). CSEA President Rea expressed her disappointment when the recommended actions of the Food Services Advisory Committee were ignored.
- Keith Harvey CTA President asked about the length of the contract (annual renewals up to 5 years) and repairs to the equipment prior to the start (bid is for equipment "as is" - no changes required; profits from food service could pay for repairs). He expressed his reservations about giving up local control of food services; nutrition is of concerns with no guarantee of financial gain.
- Lorraine Riglietti Food Service Worker noted that the workers were real people and it is not just about the money.
- Barbara Vahey MS employee/CSEA Board Member expressed concerns that
 while initially this might seem like a good idea, you run the risk with new people,
 strangers in the building; safety concerns; not just the future of the workers; not
 always about the money. Thinks it would be difficult for current employees to work
 alongside with new employees.
- Barbara Collins former Pre-K nurse stated that while the bid is financially attractive, as a school district employee for 25 years, it is reassuring when the students have a good relationship with the food service workers who are always responsive to the children's needs. These people know the students personally; must consider the whole child.
- Bernadette Ciccarello Food Service Worker has been with the district for 22 years; it is not only a job, it is a family. She personally lost everything in a fire last year and would have difficulty handling more devastation.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE SECURITY BOOTH AT LONG BEACH HIGH SCHOOL

WHEREAS, a recent incident at Long Beach High School brought to light the fact that the lack of a security booth at the entrance to the High School on the north side of the building is a condition that may affect the health, safety or property of the District, its employees and students; and

WHEREAS, the District's Architect John A. Grillo has reviewed this condition and made recommendations thereon; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined, in light of the incident at the High School, that the lack of a security booth is an emergency condition because of the potential impact upon the health, safety or property of the District, its employees or students and requires immediate action which cannot await competitive bidding; and

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that pursuant to the provisions of the General Municipal Law Section 103(4), the Board of Education declares the lack of said security booth to be an emergency, authorizes the expenditure of up to \$78,000, the estimated cost to build said security booth, and the awarding of contracts and purchasing for this work, without competitive bidding, to commence immediately and ratifies any and all such contracts and purchases made to date for all emergency work and purchases, and authorizes the Superintendent of Schools to take any and all additional steps necessary to effectuate the replacement of the affected unit.
