Such concerns should be brought to the attention of appropriate staff or to Board members by telephone, in writing, or by scheduling a personal meeting, as appropriate to the circumstances.

Visitors' comments will be limited to three (3) minutes for each agenda item upon which comment is made. Visitors are precluded from speaking on any agenda item more than once during each meeting.

3. SUPERINTENDENT’S SUSPENSION APPEAL DECISION

- A) BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education of the Long Beach City School District hereby denies/upholds the appeal of the suspension of a student identified in Confidential Attachment “A” dated March 18, 2024 and authorizes the Board President to notify the parent/guardian of its decision in writing.
- B) BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education of the Long Beach City School District hereby denies/upholds the appeal of the suspension of a student identified in Confidential Attachment “B” dated March 19, 2024 and authorizes the Board President to notify the parent/guardian of its decision in writing.

4. ADOPTION OF SEQRA – LEAD AGENCY DESIGNATION AND TYPE II DETERMINATION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Long Beach Public Schools (Board of Education) is considering building and site improvements at select properties, including Lido Elementary and Long Beach Middle School (Lido Complex), Lindell Elementary School, Transportation Department Offices, and Districtwide; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(a), “Actions or classes of actions identified in subdivision (c) of this section are not subject to review under this Part, except as otherwise provided in this section. These actions have been determined not to have a significant impact on the environment or are otherwise precluded from environmental review under Environmental Conservation Law, article 8. The actions identified in subdivision (c) of this section apply to all agencies.”; and

WHEREAS, the proposed replacement of existing turf on Veterans Field at the Lido Complex would be classified as a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5 (c)(1); and

WHEREAS, the proposed repairs to the existing bulkhead and improvements to the acoustics in the existing gymnasium at the Lindell Elementary School would be classified as Type II Actions pursuant to 6 NYCRR §§617.5 (c)(1) and (2); and

WHEREAS, the proposed replacement of Windows, Interior Doors, Hardware and Fixed Sidelights at the Lido Complex would be classified as a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5 (c) (2);

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education, after review of the proposed action and 6 NYCRR §617.5, hereby determines that the proposed projects are Type II Actions pursuant to 6 NYCRR §§617.5 (c)(1) and (2) of the implementing regulations of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, and will, therefore, by definition, have no significant adverse impact on the environment.

5. APPROVAL TO PLACE CAPITAL RESERVE FUND PROPOSITIONS ON THE BALLOT

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined that there is a need to undertake certain capital improvements, renovations and/or alterations in the District's buildings and facilities, to commence during the 2024-2025 school year ("Project") in an amount not to exceed \$1,360,610 as identified in the Building Conditions Survey of 2020, relating to Lido Elementary and Long Beach Middle School, Lindell Elementary School and the Transportation Building, on file and available for public inspection in the office of the District Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires that a proposition be presented to District voters authorizing the expenditure of available funds from the 2018 Capital Improvement Fund for that purpose; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education directs the District Clerk to include the following propositions in the legal notice of the upcoming election and to place it on the May 21, 2024 ballot:

- A) **"SHALL THE BOARD OF EDUCATION** of the Long Beach City School District (the "School District") be authorized to appropriate and expend: a sum not to exceed \$1,360,610, representing monies from the 2018 Capital Improvement Fund for the following purposes: replace turf field, windows and interior doors at Long Beach Middle School; repair bulkhead and improve acoustics in gymnasium of Lindell Elementary School; and remove fuel oil tank at the Transportation Building, as well as preliminary and other costs incidental thereto? (Because the funds to be expended hereunder are from the referenced Capital Reserve Funds, approval of this proposition will not require a tax levy upon the real property of the district.)"
- B) **"SHALL THE BOARD OF EDUCATION** of the Long Beach City School District (the "School District") be authorized and directed to transfer the unexpended balance of \$755,648 on deposit in the School District's Capital Fund, the purposes of which have been fulfilled, to the 2018 Capital Improvement Fund which was previously established pursuant to Education Law Section 3651? (Because the funds to be transferred hereunder are from the referenced Capital Fund, approval of this proposition will not require a tax levy upon the real property of the district.)"

6. ADOPTION OF LEGAL NOTICE

BE IT RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the 2024 Legal Notice for the School Board Election and Budget Vote to be held on May 21, 2024 as it appears with the materials accompanying the agenda.

7. APPROVAL OF EMERGENCY EXPENDITURE TO REPAIR STEAM PIPE IN MIDDLE SCHOOL

WHEREAS, the leaks in steam pipes associated with the District's Middle School heating system required emergency repairs and the shutting down of portions of the system; and

WHEREAS, the District needed, on an emergency basis, to have emergency plumbing services to remedy the above referenced condition and Seaford Avenue Plumbing Corp was engaged to provide the services; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with General Municipal Law Section 103(4), the ability to obtain services as referred to above in a timely manner was essential to protect the life, health and safety of District students, staff and others present in the affected District buildings and constitutes such immediate action which could not await competitive bidding or competitive offering; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education of the Long Beach City School District hereby declares the timely and immediate procurement of plumbing services at the Long Beach Middle School as referred to above to be essential to protect the life, health and safety of District students, staff and residents and to constitute action which could not await competitive bidding or competitive offering, pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 103(4); and hereby authorizes the engagement of Seaford Avenue Plumbing Corp as referred to above for a sum of \$20,198.13 without competitive bidding or competitive offering.

8. APPROVAL TO PARTICIPATE IN COOPERATIVE BID - BOCES

WHEREAS, a number of public school districts in Nassau County wish to jointly solicit proposals, together with the Nassau Board of Cooperative Educational Services ("BOCES") for pupil transportation services for the 2024-25 school year (and any renewal period) in accordance with the applicable provisions of General Municipal Law;

WHEREAS, the public school districts and the BOCES have agreed to form a Cooperative (the "Cooperative")

for this purpose;

WHEREAS, the Long Beach School District is desirous of participating in the Cooperative for joint solicitation of proposals for pupil transportation services as authorized by General Municipal Law, Section 119-0 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Inter-Municipal Cooperative Transportation Agreement attached hereto;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education authorizes the School District to participate in the Cooperative; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby approves the Inter-Municipal Cooperative Transportation Agreement (Recitals) attached hereto and authorizes the Board President to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Board of Education.

9. ACCEPTANCE OF DONATIONS

BE IT RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education accepts a donation from Our Learning Environment of \$368 for the High School Robotics Club; a donation of \$100 from 5 Star Sports Academy for the High School Robotics Club; and a donation from Center Point Church of \$150 for the High School Robotics Club.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing on the proposed school district budget will be held on May 14, 2024 at 7:00 P.M. in the Long Beach Lido Elementary School Multipurpose Room, 237 Lido Boulevard, Lido Beach, New York, and can also be viewed remotely at tinyurl.com/proudtobeLB; for the transaction of business as authorized by the Education Law, including the following items:

1. To present to the voters a detailed statement of the amount of money which will be required for the 2024-2025 fiscal year.
2. To discuss all the items hereinafter set forth to be voted upon by voting machine at the Budget Vote and Election to be held on Tuesday, May 21, 2024.
3. To transact such other business as may properly come before the meeting pursuant to Education Law of the State of New York and acts amendatory thereto.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that a copy of the statement of the amount of money required for the ensuing year for school purposes (school budget) exclusive of public monies may be obtained by any district resident beginning May 7, 2024, between the hours of 8:00AM and 4:00PM, prevailing time, except Saturday, Sunday or holidays at the Office of the District Clerk, 235 Lido Boulevard, Lido Beach, New York, at Long Beach Public Library, at 111 West Park Avenue, Long Beach, New York, and on the District's internet website. AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that said Budget Vote and Election will be held on Tuesday, May 21, 2024 at the school election districts indicated below, between the hours of 7:00AM and 9:00PM, prevailing time, at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting machine upon the following items:

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to Section 495 of the Real Property Tax Law, the School District is required to attach to its proposed budget an exemption report. Said exemption report, which will also become part of the final budget, will show how the total assessed value of the final assessment roll used in the budgetary process is exempt from taxation, list every type of exemption granted by the statutory authority, and show the cumulative impact of each type of exemption, the cumulative amount expected to be received as payments in lieu of taxes (PILOT) and the cumulative impact of all exemptions granted. In addition, said exemption report shall be posted on any bulletin board maintained by the District for public notices and on any website maintained by the District.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that petitions nominating candidates for Board of Education trustees and Library Board trustee are available from the Clerk of said School District at her office in the Administration Building, 235 Lido Boulevard, Lido Beach, New York, 11561. Nominating petitions must be filed with the Clerk of the School District not later than May 1, 2024, between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., prevailing time. Vacancies on both the Board of Education and the Library Board are not considered separate, specific offices; candidates run at large. Nominating petitions for Board of Education trustee must be directed to the District Clerk, must be signed by at least 100 qualified voters of the District; must state the name and residence of each signer; and must state the name and residence of the candidate.

Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m., prevailing time, on Tuesday, May 21, 2024.

A list of persons to whom early mail ballots and absentee ballots are issued will be available for inspection to qualified voters of the District in the Office of the District Clerk on and after Thursday, May 16, 2024, between the hours of 8:00a.m. and 4:00p.m., prevailing time, on each day prior to the day set for the annual election, except Sunday, and on May 21, 2024, the day set for the election. Any qualified voter then present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds by making his or her challenge and the reasons therefore known to the Inspector of Election before the close of the polls. A challenge to an absentee ballot may not be made on the basis that the voter should have applied for an early mail ballot.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that any person who has moved from one school election district in the Long Beach City School District to another, and who has not registered in the new school election district, and who is still registered in the district from which he or she moved, may vote in the election district in which he or she registered. Such people must advise, at the time of voting, the election inspectors of his/her new address to correct such registration.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that only those qualified voters whose names appear on the registers prepared for said school district election will be entitled to vote on Election Day. An application for registration as a military voter can be requested by contacting the District Clerk by telephone (516) 897-2108, facsimile (516) 771-3944, email ldolan@lbeach.org, mail to 235 Lido Boulevard, Lido Beach, NY, 11561, or in person (during regular office hours or between the hours of 8:15 AM to 4:00 PM); the application for registration must be received in the office of the District Clerk no later than 5:00 pm on May 6, 2024. In the request for an application for registration, the military voter is permitted to designate his/her preference for receiving the application for registration by mail, facsimile transmission or electronic mail.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that military voters who are qualified voters of the district may submit an application for a military ballot by requesting an application form from the District Clerk; in order to receive a military ballot, the military ballot application must be received no later than 5:00 pm on May 6, 2024. In the request for an application

for a military ballot, the military voter is permitted to designate his/her preference for receiving the application for a military ballot, and the military ballot, by mail, facsimile transmission or electronic mail. All qualified military voters' ballot applications and military ballots must be returned by mail or in person. Ballots for military voters shall be distributed to qualified military voters no later than May 7, 2024. Military ballots must be received by the District Clerk (1) before the close of the polls, on Tuesday, May 21, 2024, and must show a cancellation mark of the United States postal service or a foreign country's postal service, or must show a dated endorsement of receipt by another agency of the United States Government; or (2) not later than 5:00 pm on the day of the election and be signed and dated by the military voter and one witness, with a date ascertained to be not later than the day before the election.

A list of persons to whom military ballots are issued will be available for inspection to qualified voters of the District in the Office of the District Clerk on and after Thursday, May 16, 2024, between the hours of 8:00a.m. and 4:00p.m., prevailing time, on each day prior to the day set for the annual election, except Sunday, and on May 21, 2024, the day set for the election. Any qualified voter then present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds by making his or her challenge and the reasons therefore known to the Inspector of Election before the close of the polls.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to a rule adopted by the Board of Education in accordance with Section 2035 of the Education Law, any referenda or propositions to amend the budget, or otherwise to be submitted for voting at said election, must be filed with the Clerk of the Board of Education at the District Office, Administration Building, 235 Lido Boulevard, Lido Beach, New York 11561, in sufficient time to permit notice of the proposition to be included with the Notice of the Public Hearing, Budget Vote and Election required by Section 2004 of the Education Law or on or before April 22, 2024, at 4:00 p.m., prevailing time; must be typed or printed in the English language; must be directed to the Clerk of the School District; must be signed by at least 25 qualified voters of the District; and must legibly state the name of each signer. However, the School Board will not entertain any petition to place before the voters any proposition the purpose of which is not within the powers of the voters to determine, which is unlawful, or any proposition which fails to include a specific appropriation where the expenditure of monies is required by the proposition, or where other valid reason exists for excluding the proposition from the ballot.

SUBJECT: PUBLIC USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

The Board of Education recognizes that under the law it has discretion in authorizing use of a school building or grounds and in prescribing terms for said use.

School buildings and grounds may be used by Long Beach School District community groups for activities which are educational, social, recreational or civic in nature, primarily for the benefit of district residents and consistent with all applicable state laws. Any such use, however, shall not be deemed an endorsement of the activity or the purpose for which the facilities are used.

School buildings and grounds may be used by any responsible and properly organized Long Beach City School District community group. School buildings and grounds may also be used by any responsible and properly organized non-Long Beach City School District community group on a space-available basis if authorized by the Board of Education. Such groups shall be permitted to use school buildings and grounds for any of the following purposes:

- a) For instruction in any branch of education, learning or the arts;
- b) For holding social, civic and recreational meetings as well as entertainment and other uses pertaining to the welfare of the community; such meetings, entertainment and uses shall be non-exclusive and shall be opened to the general public;
- c) For recreation, physical training, and athletics.

In compliance with Section 414, New York State Education Law, which confers certain rights and imposes certain responsibilities and limitations on Boards of Education regarding the use of school buildings, grounds and other properties, and realizing that the first responsibility of the Board of Education is the education of the children and the welfare of all residents of the school district, the following policy is adopted:

1. No organization is entitled, as a matter of right, to use of a school building or grounds.
2. The school facilities must be reserved first for the use of the children and residents of the district.

SUBJECT: PUBLIC USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES (contd.)

3. Any groups that use school facilities must be non-exclusive and open to the general public.
4. The Board of Education reserves the right to revoke permission granted for the Use of School Facilities.
5. Responsibility for the preservation of order and protection of property must be assured by the organization of group using the facilities. The users must pay for any damages or additional costs incurred from such use. The applicant is to report to the Director of Facilities such damage to the Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations for follow-up.
6. All functions attended by minors must be properly and adequately supervised or chaperoned at the discretion of the District and consistent with District protocols.
7. The use of school facilities in the evening preceding a school day is discouraged by groups including students.
8. The use of school facilities in the evening must conclude, and all participants must leave the premises, by 9:30 p.m.
9. When any organization requests use of school facilities for a charity event, the organization must indicate anticipated amount of money to be donated and the percentage of funds raised to be donated.
10. Fees for use of facilities shall be determined by the Superintendent or designee. Any fees must be paid in full in advance of the use of school facilities. See Fee Schedule for applicable fees for use of school facilities.
11. A signed agreement acknowledging adherence to the District's Code of Conduct is required.

The Superintendent or the Superintendent's Designee shall prescribe regulations, subject to approval by the Board, for the use of any school facility and shall designate personnel as appropriate to schedule the use of school facilities and issue permits. Where the use of a particular facility is denied, approval for the use of an alternative facility on school property may be made.

The Superintendent has the right to request the following when an application is submitted:

1. Certificate of incorporation
2. Constitution of the organization
3. By-laws currently in effect
4. Names of officers
5. Written proof of liability insurance for no less than \$1,000,000 per incident

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6. Payment in advance for all fees as outlined in the Fee Schedule attached.
7. Backup documentation relating to the use of any fees charged or fund raising conducted.
8. Other information as requested by the Superintendent.

All permits for the use of any school facility will be issued for specified hours, will be non-transferable and will be restricted to the specific purposes for which issued. The Superintendent may grant, revoke or modify any permit at any time and may make interim changes in the regulations in appropriate situations, but must tender notice to the Board.

Permanent changes in the regulations must be approved by the Board.

District facilities may be used by the Boy Scouts or other patriotic youth groups listed as a Patriotic Society in Title 36 of the U.S. Code to the same extent as other outside groups and in accordance with the law.
